



CM announces new fire stations at Bhimtal, Dwarahat, Gauchar, Purola & Sahastradhara

The State government will set up new fire stations at Bhimtal, Dwarahat, Gauchar, Purola and Sahastradhara. The government will also establish a world-class training centre for the Fire Services in the State. These announcements were made by chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami in a programme organized on the occasion of Fire Service week at Police Line, Dehradun on Saturday.



Speaking on the occasion, the CM said that the personnel of Uttarakhand Fire and Emergency Services have saved

property worth more than Rs 53,000 crore, saved more than 27,000 humans lives and about 7,000 animals from fire since the creation of Uttarakhand. He said that the women are also contributing as fire-fighters in Uttarakhand Fire Services, which makes everyone proud. Dhami said the State government is working on strengthening the infrastructure related to fire and emergency services and modernisation of fire fighting

equipment. He said that the Union government has approved a sum of Rs 71 crore for Uttarakhand Fire and

Emergency Services. At present, efforts are underway to build 18 fire stations in the State and purchase world-class equipment to deal with fire emergencies.

The CM said that mapping of fire stations is being done in accordance with the geographical conditions and requirements of Uttarakhand, after which fire stations can be opened in remote areas. He said that the role of fire services becomes more important during natural disasters. Last year, during the disasters in Kedarnath, Tanakpur, Khattim, Arakot and Raini, the fire service employees worked with diligence and dedication. The CM directed that the Forest and Fire Service departments should respond promptly to prevent forest fires. He said that Fire Services will also play an important role in the successful and efficient conduct of the upcoming Char Dham Yatra.

In the programme, the CM felicitated seven fire-fighters who won medals during the Third All India Fire Service Games and two fire-fighters who won DGFS Disc Medal of Home Ministry, Government of India. He also flagged off 20 new fire tenders and fire fighting vehicles which were included in the fleet of the State Fire Services.

Dehradun mayor Saurabh Thapliyal, secretary Shailesh Bagauli, director general of police Deepam Seth, UPSC chairman Ravi Dutt Godiyal, chairperson of State Commission for Protection of Child Rights Dr Geeta Khanna and others attended the programme.

One more dengue case reported in Dehradun

One new case of dengue was reported in the Dehradun district on Saturday. Stating this, Chief Medical Officer (CMO) of Dehradun, Dr Manoj Kumar Sharma, said that the total number of hospitalisations related to dengue now stands at one patient being treated at Shri Mahant Indresh Hospital.

He said that this latest report increases the total count of ELISA-positive dengue cases so far to 22, including 14 patients from Dehradun and eight from other districts or States. Currently, there are 10 patients hospitalised, with eight at Shri Mahant Indresh Hospital, one at Graphic Era Hospital and one at Himalayan Hospital. Dr Sharma added that 53 dengue samples were collected on Saturday, bringing the overall total to 1,009 samples collected to date.

Notably, the typical symptoms associ-



ated with dengue include stomach pain, vomiting, headaches, fever and, in more severe cases, a drop in platelet count. Earlier, the CMO advised that while coconut water and other items can be consumed during dengue illness, they should not be relied upon exclusively. Consulting healthcare professionals is crucial when dealing with dengue.

MDDA to focus on enhancing greenery and rainwater harvesting

The Mussoorie Dehradun Development Authority (MDDA) will strictly implement the standards related to rainwater harvesting and green buildings. MDDA vice chairman Banshidhar Tiwari issued this and other instructions while chair-

Tiwari said that it is often seen that the maps passed by the MDDA contain rainwater harvesting provisions on paper but this rule is not being followed by many people on the ground. He asked the architect and draftsman association to raise

be laid on greenery in all new projects with priority being accorded to planting as many fruit and shade trees as possible. The use of solar power should be maximised for street lights and other electrical equipment in such projects to also enable energy conservation.

Those who are constructing new buildings should be encouraged to leave as much open area as possible and use interlocking tiles which will also help in conservation of groundwater. The MDDA vice chairman also sought the cooperation of the builders and architects for tree plantation of no-man's land. Tiwari said that the green buildings approved by the MDDA in the city receive special relaxation, adding that the observance of green building standards must be ensured without fail. He directed officials to establish coordination with other departments concerned for this purpose. Strict action will be taken against those violating the green building standards, he added.

Alerts issued- thunderstorms & hail likely across State today

All districts of the State are forecast to witness rainfall today with the State Meteorological Centre also issuing thunderstorms and hail warnings. The centre has issued an orange alert regarding the possibility of thunderstorms accompanied with lightning/hail/gusty wind (50-60 kmph) likely to occur at isolated places in Dehradun, Tehri, Pauri, Champawat and

The provisional State capital Dehradun is forecast to witness a partly cloudy sky with light to moderate rain/thunderstorms accompanied with lightning /gusty wind (40-50 kmph) also likely to occur. The maximum and minimum temperatures are likely to be about 34 degrees Celsius and 22 degrees Celsius respectively in



Nainital districts on Sunday. The centre has also issued a yellow warning regarding the possibility of thunderstorms accompanied with lightning/gusty wind (40-50 kmph) likely to

Meanwhile, the maximum and minimum temperatures recorded in various places on Saturday were 34 degrees Celsius and 22.1 degrees Celsius respectively in Dehradun, 32.5 degrees Celsius and 20.2 degrees Celsius in Pantnagar, 25.5 degrees Celsius and 11.4 degrees Celsius in Mukteshwar and 23.8 degrees Celsius and 14.8 degrees Celsius in New Tehri. Very light rain was reported in Badrinath and at a few other places.

DCF requests President to keep Rashtrapati Ashiana free from concrete

Dehradun Citizens Forum (DCF) has written a letter to the President of India to keep Rashtrapati Ashiana in Dehradun free from concrete. The letter of the DCF to the President Droupadi Murmu bears the signatures of more than 60 individuals.

In the letter, the signatories have requested that the proposed Rashtrapati Ashiana be developed without cutting any trees and that it be kept free from cement and concrete construction. The letter also appeals to the President for the creation of bird and butterfly parks within the premises.

The authorities had recently decided to open the Rashtrapati Ashiana covering an area of 132 acres to the general public. Terming the decision as a commendable measure, the DCF said that it would offer citizens the opportunity to enjoy lush green spaces. However, it strongly emphasises on the need to preserve the park's

natural greenery and ecological balance during the renovation process.

In its letter to the President, the forum points out that in recent years, Dehradun's natural beauty has been significantly disrupted due to road construction, housing and other infrastructure projects. Given Dehradun's unique geography and ecological fragility, the region cannot sustain large-scale concretisation. Unscientific and unplanned urban development has led to extensive concretisation, resulting in a consistent drop in groundwater levels and rising temperatures in Dehradun.

The letter urges the President to ensure that no trees are harmed under any circumstances during the park's re-development. Any such harm would worsen the environmental imbalance that Dehradun is already grappling with.

The DCF recommends that the park's new design be centred around nature. Existing natural trails should be retained,

Blood Garuda service to ease access to blood for patients at district hospital

With the commencement of the blood Garuda service, accessing blood from different hospitals for attendees at the Deen Dayal Upadhyay District Hospital will become more convenient, according to medical superintendent Dr VS Chauhan. He said that a meeting was held recently with the district magistrate Savin Bansal during which the DM directed the hospital administration to initiate the blood Garuda service. Following this, the hospital administration submitted a proposal for approval to the DM, which is expected to be granted in the next two to three days, he said.

He added that once approved, the hospital administration plans to purchase a small electric vehicle for the blood Garuda service. Funding for this vehicle will come from the hospital's annual budget, with an estimated cost of Rs six to seven lakh rupees. Additionally, the chief development officer will appoint a driver for the vehicle. Dr Chauhan emphasised the service's importance, noting that the hospital currently does not have a blood bank. As a result, attendees must visit different hospitals to arrange blood for their patients. The blood Garuda service will facilitate this process by transporting attendees to hospitals where blood is available. A fee of Rs 50 will be charged for this service, while it will be provided free of cost to underprivileged attendees.

Dr Chauhan also informed that the construction of the blood bank is underway. Out of the planned two floors, one has already been completed and the entire project is expected to be finished within six months.

It will be recalled that following the laying of the foundation stone by Health minister Dhan Singh Rawat, the construction of the blood bank at Deen Dayal Upadhyay District Hospital has officially commenced on the hospital premises in February.

VHP protests against Bengal violence, seeks President's rule

The Vishwa Hindu Parishad staged a protest against the violence and persecution of Hindus in West Bengal. The VHP members staged the protest and submitted a memorandum addressed to the President of India demanding the imposition of President's rule in West Bengal. They stated in the memorandum that under the guise of protests against the Waqf Act, violence is being spread across the State of West Bengal and the Hindus there are being persecuted, which is not tolerable.

The protesters further stated in the communication that anti-national and anti-Hindu elements have been given a free hand to carry out their conspiracy by the West Bengal government, which



should be replaced. The VHP State president Ravi Dev Anand said that the violence which started in Murshidabad was spreading across the entire State of West Bengal. "The government machinery there is not simply remaining

a mute spectator in front of the rioters but in some cases either assisting or motivating such elements. The Union government must take over the control of the administration before the situation gets out of control. The anti-national and anti-Hindu elements must also face stern legal action for their crimes," he said.

The protesters also demanded that the violence in West Bengal should be probed by the National Investigation Agency. The guilty must face legal action without delay and central forces must be deployed to maintain law and order in the State. Further, Bangladeshi and Rohingya infiltrators must be identified and deported without any further delay, the protesters stated in their memorandum.
